### 1.5 Safety Notes

Please read the following Safety Notes carefully before working with the product. The notes include important safety information about installation, usage, and maintenance.

### 1.5.1 Personal Safety

Always connect the product to a grounded circuit to avoid the risk of electrocution.

- During heating up and operation, the housing will be scalding hot. Do not touch.
- Condensation may form on the bottom of the product, creating damp or wet conditions under and around the machine. Use caution! Surfaces around the product may become slippery.
- The product is very hot during operation and it remains hot for a long time after operation has stopped.
   Do not touch the product's nozzle.
- Make sure that children, unauthorised people and animals do not obtain access to the machine.
- Eye protection is always required when operate the machine closely.

## 1.5.2 Mounting and Rigging

- For safety reasons, we do not recommend mounting the product in any capacity. Operate the product while it is on the ground only.
- The product is for indoor use only! To prevent risk of fire or shock, do not expose the product to rain or moisture.
- CAUTION: When transferring product from extreme temperature environments, (e.g. cold truck to warm humid ballroom) condensation may form on the internal electronics of the product. To avoid causing a failure, allow product to fully acclimate to the surrounding environment before connecting it to power.
- Do not mount the product on a flammable surface (linoleum, carpet, wood, paper, carton, plastic, etc.).

## 2.1 Description



The main body of the chassis is made of high-strength composite material at one time, with compact size, light weight, good durability and no rust. Main consumables are pure water, environment friendly, cost saving and space saving. The optimally designed air supply system makes the fog output farther. Suitable for small and medium-sized places such as bars, performances, and weddings.

### 2.2 Features


- Compact size, Integration in a stackable flight case makes the machine tough, durable;

# 4 SETUP

### 4.1 AC Power

The machine has a fixed voltage power supply and can work with an input voltage of AC 100 V-120V, 50/60 Hz or AC 220 V-240 V, 50/60 Hz, depending on the specific model.

To determine the product's power requirements (circuit breaker, power outlet, and wiring), use the current value listed on the label affixed to the product's back panel, or refer to the product's specifications chart. The listed current rating indicates the product's average current draw under normal conditions.



Always connect the product to a protected circuit (circuit breaker or fuse). Make sure the product has an appropriate electrical ground to avoid the risk of electrocution or fire.



Never connect the product to a rheostat (variable resistor) or dimmer circuit, even if the rheostat or dimmer channel serves only as a 0 to 100% switch.

# 4.2 AC Plug

The X-SW1800 comes with a power input cord terminated with a Lockable power connector on one end. The other end is

- · CN plug (CN market, etc.)
- EU plug (EU market, etc.)
- US plug (US market, etc.)

If the power input cord that came with your product has no plug, or if you need the change the plug, use the table below to wire the new plug:

## 4.3 Resetting the Breaker

This product is equipped with a resettable breaker. If the breaker trips, all sections of this product will lose power.

- Remove the power cord from mains power.
- Allow unit to cool for 15 minutes.
- After 15 minutes, you may attempt to reset the breaker by pressing the button with your finger.
- · Plug the product's power cord into the power outlet and continue using as recommended.

## 4.4 DMX Linking

You can link the X-SW1800 to a DMX controller using a 3-pin DMX connection. If using other DMX-compatible products with this product, you can control each individually with a single DMX controller. Instructions for connecting and configuring this product for DMX operation are in the User Manual.

## 4.5 Mounting

Before mounting the product, read and follow the safety recommendations indicated in the Safety Notes.

### 4.5.1 Orientation

For safety reasons, we do not recommend mounting the product in any capacity. Operate the product while it is on the ground only, and make sure there is adequate room for ventilation, configuration, and maintenance.

## 4.5.2 Rigging

DJPOWER recommends using the following general guidelines when mounting this product.

- Before deciding on a location for the product, make sure there is easy access to the product for maintenance and programming purposes.
- Make sure that the structure or surface onto which you are mounting the product can support the
  product's weight (see the Technical Specifications).
- When mounting the product on the floor, make sure that the product and cables are away from people and vehicles.

# 5 OPERATION

## 5.1 Preparing for Operation

- After checking that all the parts are intact and complete, position the machine on flat.
- Fill the water into water tank when power off. The capacity of water tank is 7.3 L.
- Always connect the product to a grounded circuit. Before power on, make sure it is connected with the rated voltage.
- Turn on the machine, it will immediately start heating up.

## 5.2 On-device Control Panel

To access the control panel functions, use the four buttons located underneath the LCD display.

<timer>/▲  Increases the numeric value of current function  TIMER starts the timer-controlled operation</timer>

## 5.3 On-device Control Mode & Operation

## 5.3.1 Programming

- Refer to the Menu Map to understand the menu options. The menu map shows the main level and a variable number of programming levels for each option.
- To go to the desired main level, press <MENU> repeatedly until the option shows on the display. This will take you to the first programming level for that option.
- To select an option or value within the current programming level, press <TIMER>/▲ or <VOLUME>
  /▼until the option shows on the display. If there is another programming level, you will see that first option, or you will see the selected value.
- Press <MENU> repeatedly to switch menu pages.
- Press <ENTER> /<STOP> to go back to Standby Page.

## 5.4 DMX Mode & Operation

The Machine X-SW1800 works with a DMX controller.

- Connect the product to a suitable power outlet.
- Turn the product on.
- Connect a DMX cable from the DMX output of the DMX controller to the DMX input socket on the product.

## 5.4.1 Starting Address

When selecting a starting DMX address, always consider the number of DMX channels. If you choose a starting address that is too high, you could restrict the access to some of the product's channels.



DJPOWER® X-SW1800 DMX set the starting address in the 001 - 512 DMX range and uses 3 DMX channels, which defines the highest configurable address to 510 to have all channels controllable.



Connect a DMX cable from the DMX output of the DMX controller to the DMX input socket on the product, or press repeatedly "MENU" button until the LCD shows "DMX Address". Press "▲" or "▼" to set desired DMX starting address.

## 5.4.2 DMX Mode Menu Map

When connected with DMX controller and receive DMX signal, the display will always show current DMX starting address, that can be changed anytime by pressing "▲"or" ▼".

## 5.5 Wireless remote control mode and operation guidance

In the haze machine, the wireless remote control function is used for remote control of the machine work, remote control of more than 50 meters in the open. When the machine is warmed up and the remote control function is on and no DMX signal is connected, the remote control function is effective.



The X-SW1800 can be controlled by w-4 wireless controller. There are two buttons ON the W-4 wireless remote control. Press "ON" button to start the machine and "OFF" button to stop the machine. A machine can receive up to five different coded wireless transmitters. The idea is that machines can be controlled independently from one another without being affected by other wireless transmitters.

## 5.5.1 Identify wireless transmitter

After the machine is heated, the wireless remote control function is turned on and the LCD controller will display. This state indicates that the wireless transmitter can be recognized. When the button on the wireless transmitter is pressed (it needs to stay for

Wireless Set ON

at least 1 second), if the LCD controller backlight flashes twice, then a wireless transmitter has been recognized. A machine can only recognize five wireless transmitters at most. If five wireless transmitters have been identified, the sixth one will clear the original one.

Five wireless transmitters have been identified since the last power call. If at least one radio transmitter is re-identified by this power, the previously identified radio transmitter will be cleared.

For example:

①One machine can identify three wireless transmitters. It is displayed on the LCD screen Within 15 seconds, press the "ON" button ON each of the three wireless transmitters. When the LCD backlight flickers twice, it indicates that a wireless transmitter is recognized. If the backlight does not flicker, it needs to be recognized again.

②A wireless transmitter controls two or more machines. Power on both machines at the same time, when the LCD displays on both machines , Press the "ON" button of the wireless transmitter and release the "ON" button after the LCD backlight of both machines flashes twice

## 5.5.2 Machine operation under wireless control

In the wireless control state, the smoke volume is output according to the "output smoke volume" value controlled by the liquid crystal, and the air volume is output according to the "output air volume" value controlled by the liquid crystal. For example, if the value of "output smoke volume" is set to 1% on the LCD controller, the smoke volume is the minimum smoke volume under wireless control, and if the value is set to 100%, the maximum smoke volume will work.



### Attention:

- ①. When identifying the wireless transmitter, you must wait for the LCD backlight to flicker twice before releasing the "ON" button, because only in this state can you identify the wireless transmitter.
- ②. If the wireless control function is set to off (i.e., "wireless remote control off" is displayed on the LCD), the "wireless remote control" page will not be displayed when the power is on again.
- ③. If you are currently under DMX control, the wireless control function is invalid.

## 5.1 Auto Run Last Settings


If the machine is shut off while it is operating at standalone mode (On-device & Wireless control), the "Auto Run Last Setting" will allow the machine to recover its previous same operating status when the unit is powered on again without pressing any button.



- · Shut off: Get disconnected from power source, or turn off the power switch
- · Power on: Get connected with power source, or turn on the power switch

## 5.2 Auto refill water function

When the water in the tank is low, the water pump starts to auto refill water. The LCD will flicker and show the warning message as below:





X-SW1800 can be supplied with external water tank, the water tank water level must lower than the high of machine.

# **6 TECHNICALINFORMATION**

### 6.1 Maintenance

To avoid the X-SW1800 clogging, after every 40 hours of continuous operation, use a detergent composed of 35% vinegar and 65% distilled water through the system and fog 10-15 times after finish heating-up to prevent the accumulation of particulate matter in the heating element.

The recommended cleaning procedure is as follows.

- 1) Unplug the product from power.
- 2) Empty all fluid from the machine.
- 3) Add cleaning solution to the tank.
- 4) Connect the product to power and allow it to heat up.
- Run the product in a well-ventilated area until the tank is empty. Do not allow the pump to run dry.
- 6) Refill with fog fluid to continue using the X-SW1800. Run the machine briefly to clear any cleaning solution from the pump and heater.
- 7) Excessive dust, fluid residue and dirt will degrade performance and cause overheating. Remove dust from air vents with air compressor, vacuum or soft brush. The casing could be cleaned by the damp cloth.



Test-run your DJPOWER® X-SW1800 on a monthly basis to achieve the best performance.

# 6.2 Storage

## 6.2.1 Machine Storage

Before storing the machine, clean it as described in the cleaning procedure above; however, only follow steps 1 through 5. Do not refill the tank with fog fluid if storing the machine. Cleaning the system prior to storage will help prevent any particles from condensing inside the pump or heater while not in use.
